### **OVERVIEW**

Hotel Principe di Savoia is an emblem of classic charm in the heart of Milan, where Acanto Restaurant, Il Salotto and the Principe Bar bring a twist of personality to Italian dining. On the tenth floor, Club 10 Fitness & Beauty Center, with its swimming pool and views across Milan, is the penthouse way to work out and relax.

When you walk into one of the hotel's 301 rooms and suites, you know you could only be in Milan. Each is undeniably Italian and full of unique character, a place for you to immerse yourself in the authentic vitality of this stylish city.

### **HISTORY**

From the very beginning, Hotel Principe di Savoia has been a contradiction in terms, offering traditional Italian hospitality in an unapologetically urban setting. When it first opened as 'Principe e Savoia' in 1927, its chosen plaza was on the outskirts of the 'heart' of Milan, but the location near to Stazione Centrale made it perfectly positioned for burgeoning business tycoons of the era. Its success was immediate, as guests including business people, international royalty and world-renowned artists were lured by the quiet setting among trees and tranquil gardens.

After the war, the hotel enjoyed an extensive renovation and enlargement and was officially renamed 'Hotel Principe di Savoia' in the 1980s.

Finally, the hotel joined Dorchester Collection in 2003, securing its reputation as a landmark of luxury in Italy. Beautiful restorations followed over the years, led by world-renowned architects and designers. Today Hotel Principe di Savoia continues the tradition formed since its founding – an airy oasis amongst the urban landscape, where modern luxury is woven through traditional Milanese design.

## **DÉCOR**

The interiors of Hotel Principe di Savoia represent the epitome of classic Italian glamour. Rich fabrics adorn antique furniture, heavy silk curtains frame the windows, and the many artistic details remind you that you're in the home of Italian design.

The hotel has enjoyed collaborations with well-known designers including Celeste Dell'Anna, who designed the Imperial Suites, and Thierry Despont, who created the dramatic interiors for the bar. For her restoration of the Principe Suites, London-based Francesca Basu paid tribute to La Scala theatre's famously opulent design.

The most lavish interiors await in the Presidential Suite, designed by American architect Michael Stallia. Known as 'the place' to stay in Milan, guests love its ornate décor and carefully selected furnishings inspired by famous places in Italy. The marble floors are reminiscent of St Mark's Basilica in Venice, mosaics take inspiration from Pompeiian villas, and wall sconces appear straight out of the 17th century.



## **ROOMS AND SUITES**

301 rooms and suites

This beautiful building is a symphony of eclectic rooms, each as unique as her guests. No two are quite alike, but all are glorious.

All rooms and suites are lavish examples of 19th-century design, carefully enhanced by very modern touches. Rooms and suites of note include the Mosaic Rooms, featuring a Lasa marble bath and handmade glass mosaics, and the Principe Suites, designed by Francesca Basu with hand-painted frescoes and traditional Italian furniture.

For outdoor space overlooking Piazza della Repubblica, the newly-restored Deluxe Terrace Room is a particular delight, while the Principe Executive Suite features a beautiful terrace with outdoor seating. The perfect spot for a sunny breakfast.

The design of the four Imperial Suites by Celeste Dell'Anna combines a series of contemporary and classical elements. These 230m²/2,476ft² suites have a large sitting room, featuring a handcrafted minibar console and crocodile skin writing desk. Their striking bathrooms have a Turkish bath, chromotherapy system and massage shower.

Popular with international stars and monarchs alike, the Presidential Suite has three sumptuous bedrooms, a living room, spectacular views and its own Pompeiistyle spa and private swimming pool.


### **II Salotto**
